MY RECIPE CHICKEN ADOBO

Chicken Adobo is a type of Filipino chicken stew. Chicken pieces are marinated in soy sauce and spices, pan-fried, and stewed until tender. The dish gained popularity because of its delicious taste and ease in preparation.



Ingredients

- 2 lbs chicken cut into serving pieces
- 3 pieces dried bay leaves
- 8 tablespoons soy sauce
- 4 tablespoons white vinegar
- 5 cloves garlic crushed
- 1 1/2 cups water
- 3 tablespoons cooking oil
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon salt optional
- 1 teaspoon whole peppercorn

Instructions

1. Combine chicken, soy sauce, and garlic in a large bowl. Mix well. Marinate the chicken for at least 1 hour. Note: the longer the time, the better
2. Heat a cooking pot. Pour cooking oil.
3. When the oil is hot enough, pan-fry the marinated chicken for 2 minutes per side.
4. Pour-in the remaining marinade, including garlic. Add water. Bring to a boil
5. Add dried bay leaves and whole peppercorn. Simmer for 30 minutes or until the chicken gets tender
6. Add vinegar. Stir and cook for 10 minutes.
7. Put-in the sugar, and salt. Stir and turn the heat off. Serve hot. Share and Enjoy!

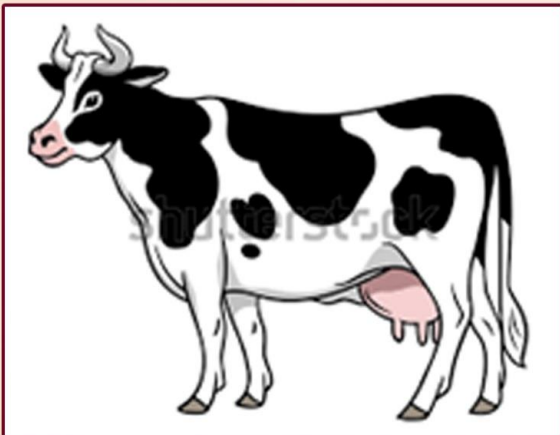

Feed on aphids & scale insects. It is called as Farmer's friend



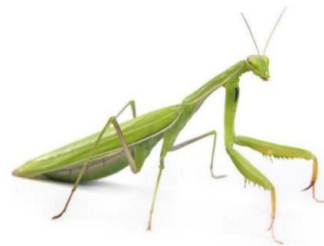
Paper Wasp

DINOSAURS

Dinosaurs were the only animals on earth for more than 150 million years. They were lizard like reptiles. Some of them were the largest and scariest creatures that ever walked on land. The word dinosaur comes from Greek words meaning 'terrible lizard'



The last dinosaur became extinct or died out, about 65.5 million years ago. Fossils of dinosaurs were first discovered in the early 1800s. Fossils are remains or impressions of a plant that have preserved in rock. By studying these fossils, scientists know that dinosaurs were ancient cousins of today's crocodiles, snakes and lizards. Scientists also believe that today's birds descended from dinosaurs.

Physical features and behavior

Dinosaurs were all different sizes. Some dinosaurs were smaller than a chicken. Others weighed as much as 100 tons- more than 10 times as much as the largest elephants.

Dinosaurs did not have hair. Their skin had a bumpy or pebbly surface. Some scientists believe that dinosaurs were gray and green in color.



These colors would have helped the dinosaurs blend in with their surroundings. Other scientists think that dinosaurs were very colorful. Bright colors would have helped males get the attention of females.

Groups

Scientists have divided dinosaurs into 2 large groups. The groups are based on the way a dinosaur's hips bones were shaped. One group is the Ornithischia, or bird-hipped dinosaurs. Members of this group called ornithischians. The other is the Saurischia, or lizard-hipped dinosaurs. Members of this group are called saurischians



Facts

1. The word "dinosaur" was originally coined by a British paleontologist named Richard Owen in 1842 and came from the Greek words *dienos* [terrible] and *sauros* [lizard]

2. Scientists now believe that Spinosaurus was the largest carnivorous dinosaur. Spinosaurus lived both on land and in water like a crocodile and was alive during the Cretaceous period [About 145 to 66 million years ago].

3. There were actually reptiles on Earth before dinosaurs. The first dinosaurs walked the Earth about 230 million years ago, the Earth was dominated by reptiles known as archosaurs and therapsids.

4. Scientists speculate that some large dinosaurs like the Apatosaurus lived as long as 300 years.

5. Many dinosaur skulls had big holes that made them lighter and helped to keep them cooler.

6. Many scientists believe that there are still a lot of dinosaurs they haven't been discovered yet.

7. The first dinosaurs ever named was Megalosaurus, named in 1824 by Reverend William Buckland.

8. Dinosaurs remains were first discovered in North America on the upper Missouri River in 1854 by American geologist Ferdinand Vandiveer Hayden.

9. The enormous *Seismosaurus* [Earthquake reptile] believed to be the biggest dinosaur, was about 150 feet long from head to tail. That's half of a football field!

10. Dinosaur remains have been found on every continent, even Antarctica.

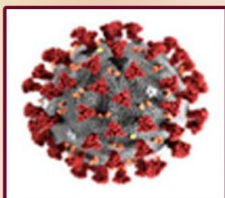





ലോകത്തിലെ ഏറ്റവും വേഗതയേറിയ കരമൃഗമാണ് ചെന്നുലി അഥവാ ചീറ്റപ്പുലി. മണിക്കൂറിൽ 70 കിലോമീറ്റർ വേഗതയിൽ സഞ്ചരിക്കാൻ അവയ്ക്കു കഴിയും. ശരാശരി ആരോഗ്യവാനായ ഒരു ചീറ്റപ്പുലിക്കു 30 ഇഞ്ച് നീളവും, 48 മുതൽ 63 കിലോ വരെ ഭാരവും കാണും. പ്രധാനമായും ആഫ്രിക്കയുടെ കിഴക്കൻ മേഖലകളിലും തെക്കൻ മേഖലകളിലും ആണ് ചീറ്റപ്പുലികളെ കണ്ടുവരുന്നത്.



വളരെ നീളവും ബലവും ഉള്ള കാലുകളും, ഉരുണ്ട മുഖവും, വഴക്കമുള്ള നട്ടെല്ലും, നീളം കൂടിയ വാലുമാണ് ചീറ്റപ്പുലികളെ വേഗതയിൽ നീങ്ങാൻ സഹായിക്കുന്നത്. ഇവയുടെ വലിയ നാസാദാരങ്ങൾ വായു അധികമായി എടുക്കുന്നതിനും, ചെവികൾ വേഗതയിൽ നീങ്ങുമ്പോൾ തലഭാഗം നിയന്ത്രിച്ചു നിർത്തുന്നതിലും സഹായിക്കുന്നു. ഈ സവിശേഷതകൾ ആണ് ചീറ്റപ്പുലിയെ നല്ല ഒരു വേട്ടമൃഗം ആക്കുന്നത്.

ഇരകളെ വേട്ടയാടുവാൻ ചീറ്റപ്പുലികൾ സംഘം ചേരുന്ന പതിവില്ല. അവയുടെ മുർച്ചയേറിയ നഖങ്ങൾ വൃക്ഷങ്ങളിൽ കയറുന്നതിനും, അവിടെ ഇരുന്നു കൊണ്ട് ഇരകളുടെ നീക്കങ്ങൾ ശ്രദ്ധിക്കുന്നതിനും സഹായിക്കുന്നു. തന്റെ ഇരയെ കണ്ടെത്തിയാൽ, അതിനെ പിന്തുടർന്ന് ശരിയായ അവസരം വരുന്നതിനു വേണ്ടി ശ്രദ്ധയോടെ കാത്തിരുന്ന് കീഴേപെടുത്തുന്നതാണ് ഇവയുടെ പതിവ്. ചീറ്റപ്പുലികൾക്കു നല്ല കാഴ്ചശക്തിയുണ്ടെങ്കിലും, രാത്രി സമയങ്ങളിൽ സാധാരണയിലും കൂടുതൽ തെളിമയോടെ കാഴ്ചകൾ കാണാൻ ഇവയ്ക്ക് സാധിക്കും. വിശാലമായ പുൽമേടുകളും, മരത്തണലുകളും ആണ് വിശ്രമത്തിനായി തിരഞ്ഞെടുക്കുന്നത്.
